· Tuesday was a day of procedural hurdles for the Pennsylvania House. The state budget has one more hurdle to clear before it can be signed. Tuesday's session in the House was a confusing one....Representatives passed a resolution letting them change the rules around the Senate-approved budget that had been turned into a stopgap. Then they used that rule change to adopt the Senate's full budget a motion was made to reconsider that vote ... but it failed ... and the budget was sent to third and final consideration. House members are expected to vote later today. There's still no agreement on how to pay for the spending plan's increases.
